<i>DOG</i>	Canine Parvovirus (CPV)	<p><i>(Enteritis)</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - depression, loss of appetite, vomiting, appears to be in pain with a tucked-up abdomen, fever, diarrhea *often bloody. - stomatitis (mouth inflammation) can occur. <p><i>(Myocarditis)</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - affects the muscle of the heart in puppies under 3 months old. - puppies stop nursing, cry out and gasp for breath. - death can occur suddenly, or within days. - recovered pups can develop chronic congestive heart failure that leads to sudden death in weeks or months. 	<p>hospitalization or home treatment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - electrolytes - nausea medication, often Pepto Bismol. - antibiotics, often amoxicillin (must be prescribed by vet.) 	<p>\$1000-\$2500 +</p> <p>\$50 -</p>	Yes
